Do Unto Others...

Lately, it is easy to succumb to all of the fear in the headlines: bankruptcies, layoffs, closures...very scary. But, what if you were small....only six years old (or eight, or ten) and your parents could not afford a place for you to live? What if you had to sleep in your car or van every night? How can we even imagine how scary THAT would be? It has been said throughout the ages: Do unto others as you would have others do unto you. It is also a well known truth that by helping others in need, we help ourselves as well. At the very least, we stop focusing on just ourselves and put our energies toward something positive. To this end, So Much Yarn is asking for your help and participation in our new **Charity Knitting Project to benefit First Place School**. This is a wonderful K through 6th school specifically for homeless children, located right here in the Central District of Seattle. Though they may have no home to go to at night, this school provides not only a safe place for them during the day, it provides them with an education (real teachers, real classes, real subjects) that will help them possibly change their own futures. The school has it's hands full, because aside from maintaining a functioning building with enough teachers, they often have to do their best to provide for essential needs of the kids.

This is where we knitters can help! First Place School has room for 54 kids and they are desperately needing hats, mittens, scarves, and small blankets to keep the students warm when the colder months arrive. So Much Yarn is happy to announce our **Charity Knitting Circle, every 2nd Thursday of the month, from 10:30-12:30, beginning July 9th**. We will provide tea and snacks and any yarns that have been donated, as well as basic patterns for the necessary projects. You will receive a 10% discount on any supplies you purchase for charity projects. I'm even bringing in some of my own "stash" from home and invite you to do the same. Here is my goal: 54 kids = 54 hats, mittens and scarves by October. Eeek....I know that may sound like a lot, but there are over 4,000 of you on our mailing list. If even only a fraction of us each made one item....just think. I hear a lot of you saying you need to try to knit from your stash because of your own budget constraints, so these small projects are great ways to do that. We even scheduled a Basic Mitten Class for those of you who feel daunted by the thumb gusset! Now, I realize that many of you will not be able to come on those Thursdays, but you are welcome to come by at other times for patterns or donated yarn to help us achieve the goal of keeping these kids warm. You can drop off finished items at any time as well. So, let's get knitting!

When it comes to books, Sock Innovation, by Cookie A., provides endless ideas for all of our favorite sock yarns: Smooshy, Happy Feet, Yukon, and Ty Dye Sox. If you’re not into socks, we have restocked the hit sensation French Girl Knits, along with Simple Style and Japanese Inspired Knits. Whether you want to take it easy or give yourself a challenge summer, we can help you find the perfect project, so come see us soon!

All the basics for creating beautiful, fun, yet simple crocheted projects! In this class, you will get comfortable with the basic stitches. We added a third week to give you time to really begin a project from our selection of fast and easy choices to inspire you on your journey into the world of crochet, including the popular market bag! We will also cover simple edgings, which can be used to finish knitting projects. (Ask for supply list)

Cables – The Basics with Lauren Lindeman

If you've never tried cables, this class is for you. They are lots of fun and much easier than they look when you know a few basics. You will learn how to twist a basic cable (with and without a cable needle), read the directions either in words or from a chart, keep track of where you are in the pattern, and how cables affect your gauge and your bind-off. If time permits, we'll even try some more advanced cables. (Ask for supply list)

PROJECTS AND SPECIAL TECHNIQUES

“Fetching” Fingerless Gloves with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 10:30 a.m.—12:30 p.m. | 6/13 & 20

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

This is one of the most popular patterns from our beloved website, knitty.com. These fingerless gloves have cables around the wrist and then again at the top to keep them snug where they should be. The thumb technique has become my all time favorite because it is far easier (and more fun!) than the traditional “gusset.” The finishing touch is a picot bindoff. This is a great class for learning to use double pointed needles and to try your hand at twisting a basic cable. Plus, it's a great traveling project to take on vacation this summer and you'll be ahead of the game for holiday gift knitting. (Ask for supply list).

Little Drawstring Bag with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 1:30—3:30 p.m. | 6/13 & 20

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$40.00

The perfect way to learn color stranding techniques and create an adorable gift at the same time. Beware, though, because it is so cute you'll want to keep it for yourself! In addition to color stranding, you will learn a picot cast on to create the top edge, an eyelet row for the drawstring, and a braided cord technique for the drawstring itself. Knit in Tahki “Cotton Classic” it is even machine washable, so it makes a great gift for babies and kids...or you could just use it to hold your current sock project. (Ask for supply list).

Intro to Intarsia with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginner
Saturday | 2:00—4:00 p.m. | 6/27

Duration: 1 Week, 2 Hours
Fee: \$25.00

Intarsia is the technique of knitting color in just an isolated section of the garment, and NOT carrying it all the way across the row. There are some simple tricks to eliminate holes where your colors meet, keeping tangles to a minimum, and reading your chart correctly. Students have the option of making an adorable baby hat while perfecting these new skills. (Ask for supply list).

Clapotis Scarf with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 10:30—12:30 p.m. | 7/11 & 18

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

This just might be the most fun scarf you'll ever knit! It is a "classic" from the wonderful website knitty.com. It is just wide enough to wear as a wrap, but not so wide that you can't just scrunch it up into a fabulous scarf. The crazy fun of it is that every so often, you drop a stitch (yes...on purpose!) and let it run all the way down, creating a ladder effect. It is knit on the bias, so you begin at one end point, increase out to the desired width, continue straight for the desired length, then decrease to create the point at the opposite end, all the while dropping stitches! We adore it in Blue Heron "Rayon Glitter," but I just finished a fingering weight version in Plymouth "Happy Feet" which I want to wear every day! You can also see tons of examples on Ravelry! Ask for supply list.

Socks with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beginning (no prior sock experience required)
Saturday | 1:00—3:00 p.m. | 7/11 & 18

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

Socks are fast, portable, fun and ADDICTING! In this two-part class, you will learn to use double pointed needles, knit in the round, turn the heel, and all the necessary foot shaping, while making a real pair of socks on worsted weight yarn. Ask for supply list.

Tulip Hat with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Intermediate
Saturday | 3:30—5:30 p.m. | 7/11 & 18

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

This Fiber Trends pattern has to be the cutest little girl hat you've ever seen! It starts with a lacy brim, then colorful tulips around the body of the hat. An adorable cord is laced through a special eyelet row and tied on the side. We love it in cotton and it will top off the summer for that special little girl in your life. The best part is that you will learn basic lace techniques AND color stranding in one project. NOTE: Because we are focusing on the lace and the color skills, this class is assuming that you are comfortable with completing the top of the hat (decreases, dp needles) on your own. Ask for supply list.

Entrelac Scarf or Wrap with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Intermediate
Saturday | 10:30—2:30 p.m. | 7/25

Duration: 1 Week, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

Entrelac is an addicting stitch because you get instant gratification every time you finish a triangle or square. It looks like basket-weave on the diagonal, and each layer is built upon the previous one. Sections are simply joined by picking up stitches or knitting them together. It is so easy! Best of all, we're using the glorious pattern from [Scarf Style](#) which is shown as a wrap but is easily reduced to scarf proportions. Our shop sample is a scarf version using "Autunno" which changes colors for you. To top it off, the fringe is tied in a lattice design to make this scarf truly unique. (Ask for supply list).

Socks on Two Circular Needles with Kristen Simpson
Skill Level: Beginning (no prior sock experience required)
Saturday | 10:30—12:30 | 8/1 & 8

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

For those of you who simply cannot make friends with double pointed needles, but still want to experience the joy of sock knitting, this class is the answer. Kristen will teach you to use two circular needles instead! In addition, you will be knitting the socks from the toe up, which makes it easier to lengthen or shorten the socks according to how much yarn you have. In this class, you will do one sock at a time, but Kristen will explain how it is possible to knit both at once. Ask for supply list.

Building Blocks Baby Blanket with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 1:00—3:00 p.m. | 8/1 & 8

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

"Building Blocks" is the perfect name for this blanket because it is constructed using the mitered square (aka bias square or domino) technique, which means that each square is built upon the previous one. This technique is perfect for variegated yarns, since they create a colorful design as you happily knit your little garter stitch squares. We LOVE it in Plymouth "Happy Feet DK," a wonderfully soft, superwash wool in simply edible colors. Our class sample is sized to be perfect for car seats and strollers, but would be easy to expand if desired. It is finished off with an easy crocheted picot edge. (Ask for supply list).

Knitted Market Bag with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 10:30—1:30 p.m. | 8/15

Duration: 1 Weeks, 3 Hours
Fee: \$35.00

Now that our location is only 2 blocks from Pike Street Market, and with all the local farmers markets in full swing, we are more motivated than ever to go green and make our own market bags. This pattern is for all of you who just couldn't be convinced to crochet our other bag. It is a free pattern from Plymouth Yarns and uses their ever-affordable cotton "Fantasy Naturale." You begin with a garter stitch base, then learn to pick up stitches around the edge and work a simple four-row lace pattern in the round to create the body of the bag. Ask for supply list.

Landscape Scarf with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 2:30 - 5:30 p.m. | 8/15 & 22

Duration: 2 Weeks, 6 Hours
Fee: \$65.00

This triangular scarf is fun and challenging at the same time. It has a beautiful picot edge which is created as you go, and is divided into sections of different texture stitches. The triangle shape is created using yarn overs as the increases, so you also get a beautiful lace feature as well. It is done on fingering or sport weight, but can later be done on larger yarn for a shawl. Never fear...we'll teach you how to keep track of where you are in the pattern! (Ask for supply list).

Shrug with Shawl Collar with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 10:30—12:30 | 8/22 & 29

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

This could be one of the easiest garments you'll ever make! It is one long rectangle from cuff to cuff which is then folded and sewn up each "arm." You then pick up stitches around the remaining open edge and work in ribbing to create both a shawl collar and beautiful curved bottom edge, which is very flattering to all shapes and sizes. The best part of all is that it can be done in any gauge yarn! We will help you design your own perfect shrug and teach you about adjusting gauge (don't worry...it's not THAT much math). We'll also discuss some extra embellishments and ruffles for the edgings, and even a 3/4 sleeve version perfect for summery weather. (Ask for supply list).

Traveling Vines Lace Scarf with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 3:30—5:30 p.m. | 8/29

Duration: 1 Week, 2 Hours
Fee: \$25.00

Lace is not as hard as it looks IF you know the right tricks! Come learn the basics of lace knitting (and the secrets to fixing errors as well) in this fun workshop. Our pattern is created with lace panels separated by simple seed stitch, so it is easily adjustable to different weights of yarn, or enlarged to create a shawl or throw. Our class project will be on worsted weight yarn to ensure quick progress and lots of potential as gifts. "Dream in Color "Classy Worsted", or Berroco "Ultra Alpaca" are great choices. For an even faster scarf, make our one-panel version in Louisa Harding's "Grace Wool & Silk" or "Mulberry Silk." (Ask for supply list).

Basic Mittens with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 10:30—12:30 | 9/12 & 19

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

There is nothing like the snuggly feeling of handknit mittens on a blustery winter day! The best part is that they are easy and fast to make and are perfect gifts for just about everyone on your list. We'll use a great basic pattern from Fiber Trends which uses worsted weight yarn. Never fear.....the thumb construction is easier than you think! Lastly, we hope that as you are honing your skills, you might help our Charity Knitting effort and make a pair for the kids at First Place School, as discussed on Page 1 of this newsletter. (Ask for supply list).

Earflap Hat with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 1:00—3:00 | 9/12 & 19

Duration: 2 Weeks, 4 Hours
Fee: \$45.00

This great hat comes from the wonderful book [Hip Knit Hats](#), by Cathy Carron. It is made from the top down, so even if you've made lots of traditional hats, this is a fun variation. It is accented with reverse stockinette "ridges" that are perfect for adding a contrast color (or two!), and the earflaps have extra detailing and a darling little tassel. The adult versions in the book are made from bulky yarn, and of course we chose Plymouth "Baby Alpaca," but you can do a baby version simply by choosing a worsted weight yarn and smaller needles. Now THAT is the perfect shower gift! (Ask for supply list).

The “Pencil Method” of Knitting with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Saturday | 3:30—5:30 p.m. | 9/12

Duration: 1 Week, 2 Hours
Fee: \$25.00

Picking (or continental) holds the yarn in the left hand. Throwing (or English) method holds the yarn in the right hand. But wait!! There is yet another choice: The Pencil Method of Throwing. Many of you who have seen me knit have asked about this method, especially because I seem to knit so fast. You still hold the yarn in the right hand, so it is technically a “throwing” method. The difference is that you hold the right needle like a pencil, as if you were going to write your name. It allows for a much smaller motion than most throwing, thus allowing for greater speed and better ergonomics. (Ask for supply list).

February Lady Sweater with Lauren Lindeman
Skill Level: Beyond Beginning
Sunday | 10:00—12:00 | 9/13, 20, 27, 10/4 & 11

Duration: 5 Weeks, 10 Hours
Fee: \$65.00

Do you think that Pamela Wynne had any idea what a following she’d have when she designed this fabulous cardigan? Well, 5,000 knitters on Ravelry can’t be wrong! This “swingy lace cardigan” is popular for many reasons. It is knit from the top down, using worsted weight yarn (so it doesn’t take forever), AND it looks good on all shapes and sizes (and Pamela provides a great range of sizes so yours will fit just right). In class, we’ll guide you through setting up the increases, working the great “one-row buttonhole” (there are three at the top of the sweater), working increases, creating the lace pattern for the main body of the sweater, and finally, picking up and completing the 3/4 length sleeves. This is a great project for those who are beyond beginning and are ready to learn some new skills. Our favorite yarn for this is Dream in Color “Classy Worsted!” This pattern is a free download at www.flintknits.com, or on Ravelry. (Ask for supply list).

Class Policies

Registration: Class registration begins immediately on a first-come, first-served basis. Pre-payment is required at the time of registration to secure your space. You may register in person at the shop or by phone with a credit card. Classes fill quickly as space is limited, so be sure to call or stop by soon!

Class Discounts: You will receive a 10% discount on all materials purchased during the course of your class. This does not apply to class fees.

Cancellations: You may cancel up to one week before the class begins for a full refund. If you cancel later than that, we will issue a refund if we are able to fill your space. Naturally if we must cancel a class for any reason, we will issue a full refund.

Skill Levels: Each of our classes lists a skill level to assist you in choosing classes appropriate for your abilities.

- **Beginning** — Able to cast on, knit, purl, cast off, with some experience decreasing and increasing.
- **Beyond Beginning** — Comfortable with the above skills but still a bit nervous reading those patterns and tackling a sweater!
- **Intermediate** — Successfully completed a few projects/garments and able to read most patterns.
